Move on When Ready Fact Sheet (FY 12)

What is Move on When Ready (MOWR)? Move on When Ready provides opportunities for high school juniors and seniors to attend a college, university, or technical college full-time to earn both high school and college credit.

Student Eligibility:

- Upcoming (2011-2012) high school juniors and seniors
- Must be on-track for graduation
- Must have been a legal resident of Georgia for one year and continue to meet Georgia Residency requirements for the purpose of MOWR eligibility.
- Must have been a full-time student in a Georgia Public School during the prior school year (2010-2011)
- Must meet all eligible post-secondary admissions/acceptance requirements

Costs:

- **Georgia Department of Education:** Tuition, books, fees and materials (maximum of 12 hours credit)
- **Students and Parents/Guardians:** Food, lodging, transportation, and all expenses above 12 hour course credit.

Questions and Answers:

1. **Are MOWR students required to take End of Course Tests (EOCTs), end of pathway assessments, and Georgia High School Graduation Tests (GHSGTs)?** Yes.
2. **Can students participating in the MOWR program still participate in their high school of record's extracurricular activities and sports?** Yes, as long as their academic schedule can accommodate practices, games, etc.
3. **Can students participate in college sports?** No. Students are not eligible to participate in college competitive sports at any collegiate level.
4. **Is part-time or full-time status required?** Full-time status is required for MOWR, and all courses are taken on the college campus or the postsecondary's virtual dual enrollment courses that have been approved by Ga. Department of Education.
5. **What courses are available?** Approved academic, career technical, fine arts and elective courses.
6. **When are the courses offered?** MOWR courses may be taken during the traditional public school day or beyond the regular hours.
7. **Will MOWR credit transfer out of state?** There are no guarantees or established agreements with other states.
8. **What happens if a student is unsuccessful in the MOWR program?** The student could lose all credits and get off track for graduation. In class failure situations the student, parent and counselor should always meet to review the continuation of the program.
