Farmer, N., *House of Scorpion*

A sci-fi thriller about a young clone struggling for acceptance in his tumultuous, sheltered world.

Lowery, L., *Gossamer*

There is method to the madness of dreams...

MacHale, D.H., *Pendragon series*

Bobby is a seemingly normal fourteen-year-old boy. But there is something very special about Bobby. He is going to save the world.

Paver, M., *Wolf Brother*

Twelve-year-old Tarak and his guide, a wolf cub, set out on a dangerous journey to fulfill an oath the boy made to his dying father--to travel to the Mountain of the World Spirit seeking a way to destroy a demon-possessed bear that threatens all the clans.

White, A., *No Child's Game: Surviving Antarctica Reality TV 2083*

In the year 2083, five fourteen-year-olds reenact Scott's 1910-1913 expedition to the South Pole as contestants on a reality tv show, secretly aided by a Department of Entertainment employee.

DuPrau, J., *City of Ember series*

In the year 241, twelve-year-old Lina trades jobs on Assignment Day to be a Messenger to run to new places in her city, perhaps even to glimpse Unknown Regions. Book one in the *Ember* series.

Clements, A., *Things Not Seen*

When fifteen-year-old Bobby wakes up and finds himself invisible, he and his parents and his new blind friend Alicia try to find out what caused his condition and how to reverse it.

Coombs, K., *The Runaway Princess*

Fifteen-year-old Princess Meg uses magic and her wits to rescue a baby dragon and escape the unwanted attentions of princes hoping to gain her hand in marriage through a contest arranged by her father, the king.

Meiling, O.R., *Hunter's Moon*

Gwen travels to Ireland to visit her cousin, expecting a summer of backpacking, late nights, and the usual road trip adventures.

Patterson, J., *Maximum Ride: The Angel Experiment*

After the mutant Erasers abduct the youngest member of their group, the "bird kids," who are the result of genetic experimentation, take off in pursuit and find themselves struggling to understand their own origins and purpose.

Etchemendy, N., *Power of Un*

When he is given a device that will allow him to "undo" what has happened in the past, Gib is not sure what event he should change in order to keep his sister from being hit by a truck.

Lowrey, L., *Messenger*

In this novel that unites characters from "The Giver" and "Gathering Blue," Matty, a young member of a utopian community that values honesty, conceals a healing power he cannot explain.

Gaiman, N., *Coraline*

Telling the difference between reality and illusion can sometimes mean your soul.

Riordan, R., *Lightning Thief*

Percy, expelled from six schools for being unable to control his temper, learns that his father is the Greek god Poseidon, and is sent to Camp Half Blood where he is befriended by a satyr and the demigod daughter of Athena who join him in a journey to the Underworld to retrieve Zeus's lightning bolt and prevent a war. Book one in the *Percy Jackson and the Olympians* series.

Smith, R., *Cryptid Hunters*

Twins, along with a mysterious uncle, are dropped into the middle of the Congolese jungle in search of their photojournalist parents.

Oppel, K., *Airborn*

Matt, a young cabin boy aboard an airship, and Kate, a wealthy young girl traveling with her chaperone, team up to search for the existence of mysterious winged creatures reportedly living hundreds of feet above the Earth's surface.

Rupp, R., *Journey to the Blue Moon*

After a gang of talking rats transports a boy to the moon, he gains a new perspective on time.

Funke, C., *Inkheart series*

One cruel night, Meggie's father reads aloud from INKHEART, and an evil ruler escapes the boundaries of fiction, landing instead in their living room. Book one in the *Inkheart* series.

Pattou, E., *East*

A young woman journeys to a distant castle on the back of a great white bear who is the victim of a cruel enchantment.

Tolkien, J.R.R., *The Hobbit*

This tale creates the fantasy called middle earth and its dwarf-like creatures, the hobbits. Book one of the *Lord of the Rings* trilogy.

Snyder, Z.K., *The Egypt Game*

It was only a game for six children until an oracle told the truth and a murderer appeared...

Choldenko, G., *Al Capone Does My Shirts*

Moose Flannagan moves with his family to Alcatraz so his dad can work as a prison guard and his autistic sister, Natalie, can attend a special school. Contains mild language and sexual themes.

Woods, B., *Emako Blue*

Monterey, Savannah, Jamal, and Eddie have never had much to do with each other until Emako Blue shows up at chorus practice, but just as the lives of the five Los Angeles high school students become intertwined, tragedy tears them apart.

Hobbs, V., *Sheep*

After a fire destroys the farm where he was born, a border collie acquires a series of owners and learns about life as he seeks a home and longs to fulfill his life's purpose of shepherding sheep.

Gauthier, G., *Happy Kid*

After his mother bribes him into reading a self-help book on how to form satisfying relationships and enjoy a happy life, cynical eighth-grader Kyle finds there may be more to the book than he realized.

Graff, L., *The Thing About Georgie*

Georgie's dwarfism causes problems, but he could always rely on his parents, his best friend, and classmate Jeanie the Meanie's teasing, until a surprising announcement, a new boy in school, and a class project shake things up.

Lupica, M., *Miracle on 49th Street*

Josh is MVP of the Celtics and a media darling with a spotless reputation. He has it all . . . including a daughter he never knew.

Clements, A., *No Talking*

The noisy fifth grade boys of Laketon Elementary School challenge the equally loud fifth grade girls to a "no talking" contest.

Lupica, M., *Summer Ball*

When you're the smallest kid playing a big man's game, the challenges never stop-especially when your name is Danny Walker.

Lupica, M., *Travel Team*

Canines tell the story of what happens when Old Seadog decides to take one last sail with his friends in search of treasure.

Curtis, C.P., *Bucking the Sarge*

Deeply involved in his cold and manipulative mother's shady business dealings in Flint, Michigan, fourteen-year-old Luther keeps a sense of humor while running the Happy Neighbor Group Home For Men, all the while dreaming of going to college and becoming a philosopher. Contains mild language and sexual themes.

Historical Fiction

Spinelli, J., *Milkweed*

A street child, known to himself only as Stophief, finds community when he is taken in by a band of orphans in Warsaw ghetto which helps him weather the horrors of the Nazi regime.

Park, L.S., *When My Name Was Keoko*

With national pride and fear, a brother and sister face the increasingly oppressive occupation of Korea by Japan during World War II, which threatens to suppress Korean culture entirely.

Bloor, E., *London Calling*

Martin Conway comes from a family filled with heroes and disgraces. His grandfather was a statesman who worked at the US Embassy in London during WWII. Contains mild language.

Collier, J.L., *The Empty Mirror*

Nick is an orphan who has grown up in his uncle Jack's care on the wild, wooded coast of New England. His parents died when he was a baby during a terrible influenza epidemic that swept the region not long after World War I.

Avi, *True Confessions of Charlotte Doyle*

On a trans-Atlantic voyage, Charlotte learns the captain is murderous and the crew is rebellious.

Ellis, D., *Mud City*

Shauzia dreams of seeing the ocean and eventually making a new life in France, but it is hard to reconcile that dream with the terrible conditions of the Afghan refugee camp where she lives.

Kadohata, C., *Weed Flower*

Sumiko feels her life has been made up of two parts: before Pearl Harbor and after it.

Ryan, P.M., *Esperanza Rising*

Esperanza and her mother are forced to leave their life of wealth and privilege in Mexico to go work in the labor camps of Southern California, where they must adapt to the harsh circumstances facing Mexican farm workers on the eve of the Great Depression.

Smith, R., *Elephant Run*

Nick's father and others are taken prisoner when his plantation in Burma is invaded by the Japanese, leaving Nick and Mya to risk their lives in order to free them from the POW camp.

Carbone, D., *Blood on the River James Town 1607*

Traveling to the New World in 1606 as the page to Captain John Smith, twelve-year-old orphan Samuel Collier settles in the new colony of James Town, where he must quickly learn to distinguish between friend and foe.

Dahlberg, M., *The Story of Jonas*

In the mid-1800s, a slave boy dreams of escaping to freedom while on a journey with his master's n'er-do-well son.

White, R., *Way Down Deep*

In the West Virginia town of Way Down Deep in the 1950s, a founding called Ruby June is happily living with Miss Arbutus at the local boarding house when suddenly, after the arrival of a family of outsiders, the mystery of Ruby's past begins to unravel.

Klein, L., *Two Girls of Gettysburg*

Two cousins encounter different experiences with war as the Battle of Gettysburg is waged.

Konigsburg, E.L., *The Outcasts of 19 Schuyler Place*

In this follow-up to E. L. Konigsburg's *Silent to the Bone*, the Newbery Medal-winning author focuses her attention on the history of Margaret Rose Kane, Connor's half sister, taking readers back to 1983 and Margaret's surefooted effort to keep her uncles' towers from being destroyed.

Hahn, M.D., *Promises to the Dead*

Jesse leaves home to help a runaway slave find a safe haven in the early days of the Civil War.

Paulsen, G., *The Legend of Bass Reeves*

The story of Bass Reeves who was born a slave and later became one of the most respected federal marshals in Oklahoma and Texas.

Beals, M., *Warriors Don't Cry*

In 1957, Melba Pattillo became a warrior on the front lines of a civil rights firestorm. Following the 1954 Supreme Court ruling, *Brown v. Board of Education*, Melba was one of nine teenagers chosen to integrate Little Rock's Central High School.

Hunt, I., *Lottery Rose*

Abused by his mother and her boyfriend, Georgie Burgess learns to hide his hurt. When Georgie wins a small rosebush in a grocery store lottery, he gives it all the love and caring he has never had. His life begins to open up when the courts send him to a home for boys. Slowly, and not without pain, Georgie learns to give--and to receive love. Contains themes of child abuse.

Cushman, K., *The Midwife's Apprentice*

In medieval England, a homeless girl gains the three things she most wants: a full belly, a contented heart, and a home.

Nonfiction

Orlev, U., *Run, Boy, Run*

A boy escapes the Warsaw Ghetto and survives the war in the Nazi-occupied Polish countryside.

Schyffert, B.U., *The Man Who Went to the Far Side of the Moon*

Describes the experiences of Apollo 11 astronaut Michael Collins as he circled the moon while Neil Armstrong and Buzz Aldrin walked on it; and explains what everyday life was like on "Columbia," presents background on the three astronauts, and includes photos of Collins and his family.

Greenberg, J. and Jordan, S., *Runaway Girl: The Artist Louise Bourgeois*

A look at the life and work of sculptor Louise Bourgeois. Known for her graphic, sometimes disturbing, yet always personal artworks, Bourgeois broke down barriers for women in the male-dominated art world as she struggled to make sense of her past.

Lawlor, L., *Magnificent Voyage: An American Adventurer on Captain James Cook's Final Expedition*

Survive Middle School, then Survive THIS!

Berger, M., *Mummies of the Pharaohs: Exploring the Valley of the Kings*

A fascinating look at the famed Valley of the Kings, where over 50 of the pharaohs of Ancient Egypt's New Kingdom were buried, including King Tutankhamun with all his splendid treasures, Ramses II, Akhenaten, and more.

Gutman, D., *Baseball's Biggest Bloopers: The Games That Got Away*

Some ball players are remembered for their home runs and great plays--but imagine being famous for blowing the game. Offering play-by-play descriptions of the games, historical trivia, and lifetime statistics of key players, this book shows how life goes on even after the worst moments--and how a little mistake can sometimes make a very big difference.

Fleming, C., *Ben Franklin's Almanac: Being a True Account of the Good Gentlemen's Life*

Brings together eighteenth century etchings, artifacts, and quotations to create a scrapbook of the life of Benjamin Franklin.

Partridge, E., *This Land was Made for You and Me: The Life and Songs of Woody Guthrie*

A biography of Woody Guthrie, telling about his travels throughout the U.S. and discussing how his experiences influenced his music.

Fleischman, J., *Phineas Gage: A Gruesome but True Story about Brain Science*

A railroad construction foreman, Phineas was blasting rock near Cavendish, Vermont, in 1848 when a thirteen-pound iron rod was shot through his brain. Miraculously, he survived another eleven years and became a textbook case in brain science.

Cummins, J., *Tomboy of the Air: Daredevil Pilot Blanche Stuart Scott*

While American women were fighting for their right to vote, Blanche Stuart Scott asserted her right to fly. She had always been a daredevil and couldn't resist the temptation...

Murphy, J., *An American Plague: The True and Terrifying Story of the Yellow Fever Epidemic of 1793*

Provides an account of the yellow fever epidemic that swept through Philadelphia, discussing the chaos that erupted when people evacuated in droves, leaving the city without government, goods, or services, and examining efforts by physicians, the Free African Society, and care for the sick.

Ross, V., *The Road to There: Mapmakers and Their Stories*

Describes the lives and inspirations of several important mapmakers throughout history, such as Cheng Ho, Captain James Cook, and Phyllis Pearsall, and includes map reproductions.

Philbrick, N., *Revenge of the Whale: The True Story of the Whaleship Essex*

Recounts the 1820 sinking of the whaleship "Essex" by an enraged sperm whale and how the crew of young men survived against impossible odds. Based on the author's book "In the Heart of the Sea."

Crowe, C., *Getting Away With Murder: The True Story of the Emmett Till Case*

A persuasive text regarding domestic violence in America.

Bredeson, C., *After the Last Dog Died: The True-Life, Hair-Raising Adventure of Douglas Mawson and His 1912 Antarctic Expedition*

Describes the life and career of the Australian explorer, Sir Doulgas Mawson, focusing on his 1912 scientific expedition to Antarctica.

Poetry and Short Stories

Nelson, M., *Carver, a Life in Poems*

A collection of poems that provide a portrait of the life of African-American botanist and inventor George Washington Carver.

Nye, N.S., *What Have You Lost?*

A collection of poems on all kinds of loss.

Woodson, J., *Locomotion*

Inspired by his teacher, eleven-year-old Lonnie begins to write about his life in a series of poems in which he discusses his feelings about his friends, his foster mom, his little sister Lili, and the death of his parents.

Realistic Fiction

Coy, J., *Crackback*

When Miles Manning, a successful high school football player, discovers his teammates are using steroids--and one of them is his best friend--he's faced with a tough decision: Is he willing to do what it takes to win?

Bunting, E., *Summer of Riley*

"Maybe that's the reason people get dogs, to kind of close up the empty places inside them."

Spinelli, J., *Crash*

Seventh-grader John "Crash" Coogan has always been comfortable with his tough, aggressive behavior, until his relationship with an unusual Quaker boy and his grandfather's stroke make him consider the meaning of friendship and the importance of family.
