Dr. Robin Hines has served as Superintendent of Houston County Schools since June 2010. Prior to becoming superintendent, he was the Assistant Superintendent for School Operations from 2008 to 2010. He also served as Principal of Northside High School from 2006 to 2008. An educator for 29 years, he began his teaching career in 1982 as a teacher and coach for Thomasville City Schools. He was in the classroom until 1995 when he became an assistant principal for Dougherty Comprehensive High School in Albany, Georgia. He next served as principal of Charlton County High School in Folkston, Georgia from 1998 until 2001. From 2001 until taking the helm at Northside High, Dr. Hines served as principal of Jackson County Comprehensive High School in Jefferson, Ga.
