III. AYP Update

We were behind in graduation rate and language arts score and did not make initial standards. With the help of some qualified teachers 13 students worked hard over the summer to increase their scores. 9 seniors passed the last part of the graduation test. WRHS Graduation rate was 85.1%.

AYP is going away this year and there will be a performance based model. Georgia is one of the states that will have state control instead of federal for education decisions. The new improvement/performance based model has not been finalized but will include ECOT scores, graduation rate, SAT scores possible and attendance.

WRHS was 1 out of 17 Title 1 high schools in Georgia to make AYP.

Mr. Monday is pleased and states we need to continue to move forward. A concern for WRHS and the state is Social Study exams. The previous schedule had impact Social studies. We will start in January working with students in Social Studies.

IV. Extracurricular

New Regions have been established. Our region will include WRHS, NHS, HOCO, Jones County, and 4 Augusta schools, Greenbriar, Lakeside, Evans and Grovetown.

WRHS Average about 100 Northside students each year. They have to be bused. They can now participate in extracurricular activities.
